

## **Kum-Duble Class Scholarship University United Methodist Church**

The Kum-Duble Class Scholarship was created by the Kum-Duble Sunday School Class in 1978 to help students with the costs of higher education.

### **Eligibility**

- Students must be enrolled or accepted in either a two or four year institution of higher education.
- Students must be enrolled for and remain registered in a minimum of 12 semester hours or equivalent.
- Student must maintain at least a “C” (2.0) average.
- Students may receive funds from the Kum-Duble Class Scholarship no more than 8 semesters in total. Awards will be selected and funded twice a year (Fall and Spring Semesters); new applications must be submitted for consideration for each award.
- Subsequent scholarships are contingent upon successful completion of previous academic work.
- Applicant may be a Member or non-member of UUMC.

### **Scholarship Considerations**

- Children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren of the members of the former Kum-Duble Sunday School Class will be given preference.
- Awards will be contingent upon the student’s enrollment in the institution listed in his/her application. If the student delays enrollment, the award will not be issued.

### **Application Process**

- Complete the Kum-Duble Class Scholarship application by **June 1** for Fall applications and **January 1** for Spring applications.
- Submit official copy of most recent high school or college transcripts.
- Submit two letters of recommendation. If reapplying, new letters of recommendation are required annually.
- Submit an essay of 250 words relative to future plans and goals. If reapplying, a new essay is required annually.

- Awards will be distributed directly to the educational institution. Applicants must supply payment contact and instructions.

### **Scholarship Requirement**

- Award recipients are required to submit a follow-up report regarding progress during the semester of the award (i.e. transcript, narrative summary of study, or letter describing academic progress) no later than 30 days after the completion of the semester for which the scholarship was awarded.
